# BOYNTON BEACH GARDEN CLUB IS PLANNING A BUS TRIP TO MCKEE AND HEATHCOTE BOTANICAL GARDENS TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 2022

The McKee Botanical Garden is a non-profit, subtropical garden in Vero Beach. It was founded in 1929, when Waldo Sexton and Arthur

McKee purchased an 80-acre tropical hammock along the Indian River. With a renewed focus on native horticulture, the Garden remains true to its jungle heritage, featuring 10,000 native and tropical plants as well as one of the area's largest collections of water lilies.

The Garden has garnered a national reputation for excellence and is known for its award-winning exhibitions, including the current Stickwork exhibit. Internationally acclaimed artist, Patrick Dougherty, returned to McKee for his second Stickwork installation. Patrick, his son Sam, and a group of dedicated McKee volunteers worked tirelessly for three weeks climbing on scaffolding, weaving, bending, trimming and shaping willow saplings into a one-of-a-kind sculpture made exclusively for McKee. Dougherty's nature-based sculptures are intended to interact with their surroundings, adding elements of whimsy and visual energy to familiar settings. No tree saplings are killed outright in creating one of his sculptures.



Heathcote Botanical Gardens is a five-acre subtropical botanical garden located in Fort Pierce. Heathcote is a non-profit, 501 (c)3 educational foundation that bills itself as the "Green Heart of the Treasure Coast."

Heathcote consists of an assortment of specialty gardens including a Japanese, Reflection, Herb, Rainforest, Native Plants and a Palm & Cycad Walk. Gracing the areas in between these specialty gardens are borders of flowering shrubs, bulbs,

trees, vines and other assorted herbaceous plants. The James Smith Bonsai Gallery features 100 bonsai trees on permanent display.

**HORTICULTURE:** Gaillardia: Jane Gavlick

After the presentation by Ryan Leavengood about "Plant This, Not That" I decided to look up Gaillardia, the Blanket Flower, which is an "almost" native. The divide between native and introduced is whether the plant was here when the first Europeans touched North American shores.

I know the best planting time would be spring, because it blooms May through September, so keep it in mind for next year.

# Gaillardia

Also known as blanket flower, Gaillardia pulchella is a sturdy perennial with bright flowers that bloom throughout the summer and into the fall.

A recent discovery suggests that *Gaillardia pulchella* is not actually native to Florida (<u>Weakley 2020</u>¹), as previously thought. It's native to the southwestern United States, and was likely introduced to the eastern states sometime in the last few centuries.

Still, blanket flower is an excellent nectar and pollen resource. It also remains on our list of Florida-Friendly plants. But for gardeners who prefer native wildflowers, consider lanceleaf blanketflower (*Gaillardia aestivalis*). This wildflower has much of the charm of *G. pulchella* and is native to North and Central Florida.



The flowers are single, semi-double, double, and even tubular, and grow on long stems above the long, soft, hairy leaves. Difference in colors and variations in petal shapes are a result of natural hybridization. They are usually reddish purple or orange-red with yellow tips, but can also be solid yellow, orange, or red, and make excellent, long-lasting cut flowers that attract butterflies. Gaillardia re-seeds itself, so don't be surprised if you see it year after year.

Use gaillardia in the landscape as a groundcover, or plant it in containers. It can also be used as an accent or in mass plantings. Gaillardia can be planted anywhere in the state and will tolerate extreme heat, sun, sandy soils, and even salt, making it a great choice for the coastal landscape.

Indian Blanket is an annual, although some say it is biennial; the average lifespan is 2 years, though it self seeds freely. The plant grows to about 12 to 24 inches tall. It does best in a hot climate in full sun, tolerating heat and dry conditions. It likes sandy soil and needs good drainage; rich soil will produce large floppy plants with few flowers.

The flowers attract butterflies, which, of course, attract butterfly gardeners.
